

## Call for a Swedish editorial team för Scandinavian Political Studies starting in Spring 2026

*Scandinavian Political Studies* (SPS) is the leading journal on politics and public administration in the Nordic countries and is an indispensable source for research and teaching on Nordic politics at the national, supranational, regional and local level. SPS welcomes contributions that draw on Nordic data, or that have clear relevance for the politics of Nordic countries. It is published by *Wiley Blackwell* on behalf of the *Nordic Political Science Association* (NoPSA).

**The editorial teams rotate between the NoPSA members and is currently in Iceland. The next editorial team will be in Sweden between 2026 and 2028.**

The editorial team consists of 2-3 editors from one university. Remuneration is £5500 and it is up to the editorial team how it is divided.

The Swedish Political Science Association board will nominate the Swedish editorial team to the NoPSA board.

**Please send us a proposal if you want to be part of the next editorial team! We are especially encouraging proposals from universities and university colleges that have not previously hosted SPS.**

The proposal should include:

- **Names and affiliations** of two or three individuals (preferably from the same university) willing to take on the editorial task.
- The proposal should be sent to **Hanna Bäck** ([hanna.back@svet.lu.se](mailto:hanna.back@svet.lu.se)) no later than **August 1, 2025**.

### Application Requirements

Applications should include:

1. **A concise CV (maximum two pages)** detailing:
  - Education and employment history
  - Editorial experience
  - Key publications
  - Involvement in open science initiatives
2. **A short statement (approximately 500 words)** outlining:
  - Your vision for the role of Scandinavian Political Studies
  - Broader research interests and methodological approaches
3. **A formal statement of support** from the head of the department, confirming that the department supports the application submitted by the group.
